Dues/Fundraising:

- To remain competitive, Fairfax Crew maintains a fleet of over a dozen racing shells (boats that cost as much as \$40K each), a large boat trailer for travel, several coaching launches/motors and advanced electronics for all boats.
- Dues are based upon projected team size, coaching and equipment needs and other factors. Dues are finalized each fall, presented to the membership and approved in October.
- The goal is to keep the dues as low as possible while meeting current and future obligations. There are four payments.
 - o A \$275 non-refundable deposit is due on October 30, 2019.
 - o The second payment in the amount of \$275 is due on November 26, 2019.
 - o The third payment in the amount of \$275 is due at the January Membership Meeting
 - o The fourth and final payment will be due before the first regatta in March, 2020. The final payment amount will be established by the budget presented to and approved by team membership during the October Membership Meeting. The goal is to keep the final payment to \$275 for a total annual dues of \$1,100.
- All rowers/families are expected to participate in fundraising in order to help make the dues more affordable for all.
 - o Varsity Fundraising Commitment = \$600, Novice Fundraising Commitment = \$300.
- Uniforms are required by Virginia Scholastic Rowing Association and are an additional cost (historically less than \$100).
 Optional "away" regattas (typically one or two per season, such as the Stotesbury Regatta in Philadelphia) also require additional costs for transportation, lodging, meals and regatta fees (historically around \$200).
- Scholarships can become available: Please contact our Booster Club President if you need an alternate payment plan or to inquire about potential scholarships.

Refunds: Once paid, no portion of the dues payment is refundable regardless of circumstance.

PRACTICE SCHEDULE

Winter LAND Training: Mid November through mid/late-February

- Winter Land Training is held at Fairfax High School after school Monday through Friday.
- Practice runs from 3:30-5:30pm each day, though coaches may adjust the schedule.
- Rowers will be responsible for ensuring they have transportation home, either by late buses, driving, or carpools.

Spring WATER Training: Mid-February through late May.

Practices are held at Sandy Run Regional Park, after school Monday-Friday from 4:00pm -7:00pm.

TRANSPORTATION

Parent and Student Carpools:

• Although the Crew Board/Team cannot arrange carpools, we facilitate opportunities for members to create/join carpools at our January General Membership meeting.

- Parents and students organize carpools from Fairfax High School to Sandy Run Regional Park, and from the river
 practice to their homes. Those families participating in carpools should share in driving the carpools and/or contribute
 to gas costs.
- Students may drive to and from river practice. However, student drivers MUST abide by all Virginia State driving laws including the number of passengers allowed, seatbelts and speed limits, especially at the park.

FAIRFAX CREW BOOSTER CLUB EXPECTATIONS

Students who pay dues and who respectfully participate in practices will be given opportunity to row during practices as determined by the coaching staff. However, the following should be understood:

- Please remember that Crew is a competitive sport. The Coaches alone will decide which Rowers race in regattas, and these decisions are absolute. Seniority and good behavior alone do not guarantee racing seats.
- Disrespectful behavior will not be tolerated; and clear expectations of conduct will be outlined at the start of the season. Respect for rules and our coaches' authority is a necessity for team participation.
- Each family will be asked to participate as volunteers throughout the season. Like many teams in Fairfax County,
 Fairfax Crew uses a point based system to define, encourage and track both fundraising and volunteering contributions of families.
- The team is obligated to fill volunteer positions as defined by the Virginia State Rowing Association (VASRA). The team if fined for failing to fill these volunteer roles which may include driving a launch (additional training required), helping with concessions, helping with weigh-in (for lightweight teams) or other VASRA duties.

PARENT / GUARDIAN CODE OF CONDUCT

- 2. Never criticize members of the Fairfax Crew team (includes coaches, assistant coaches, rowers and coxswains).
- 3. Respect directions given by VASRA and other Regatta officials, staff and volunteers.
- 4. Respect the authority of the coaches' decisions (e.g., boat lineups, regatta participation, etc.), and recognize that coaching staff makes decisions with the best intentions for the program.
- 5. Encourage athletes to bring individual or team concerns to the Team Captains and/or Coaches.
